Mayor Trulove

- I called to order the public hearing at 7:05 PM.

- Applicable decision criteria will be discussed.
- Asked if any conflicts of interest, ex-parte contacts, or any biases to be declared by any council member?
- (No council member declares)

City Planner Eckert

- Read the staff reported present in the council packet.
- No questions for staff about the staff report.

Mayor Trulove

- Asked if the city received any written testimony prior to tonight's meeting?

City Manager Samaniego

- No new testimony was written from any government agencies or the public.

Mayor Trulove

- Anyone wishing to testify should state their full name and mailing address for the record.

Adam Miller (Appellant)

- The definition of "development" and "use" is the issue for the appeal.
- Believe their development and use should be for new construction.
- Not on using an existing structure.
- Belives traffic will be less under PuroClean.
- Questions the definition of time.
- Concerned that this ruling could set a precedence and nobody would want to move businesses in the City of Tangent.

Mayor Trulove

- Asked if there is any additional testimony in support of the appeal? (none)
- Asked if there is any testimony in opposition to the appeal? (none)

City Planner Eckert

- No evidence of fewer vehicles.
- The ruling has been consistent with recent cases.

Mayor Trulove

- Any neutral or general comments that anyone would like to share? (none)

Councilmember Jones

- Asked if L&M did improvements with no new building?

City Planner Eckert

- No new buildings on L&M and demolished a building.
- Had to improve the roadway.

Adam Miller

- A question about Conditional Use for L&M.

City Planner Eckert

- Confirmed they are on a Conditional Use.

- The public hearing is closed since nobody wishes to remain the record open, and the Appellant waived the seven days for final written arguments.

Public Hearing FY 2022 Budget: 7:32 PM.

City Manager Samaniego

- Budget Committee passed the budget.
- A couple of changes include AccuFund Grant Module to track grant money.
- There is some cost, but the Budget Committee felt this would help track the high amount of grant money expected in 2021.
- The council may vote to keep it in there or not.
- COLA is now 6.1 when it was initially approved for 2.1 COLA.
- The city may adjust COLA or change leave it at 2.1.

Councilmember Tedrow

- Tracking the CPI is increasing and was near 5%.
- Intelligent people on both sides of the issues on whether it is transitory or not.
- I'm in the camp of leaving it at 2.1% and doesn't feel like anything is gained.
- If it continues, we may look into adjustments in the next year.
- Not in support of raising the COLA.

Finance Director Manfredo

- May I put in my two cents.
- It's going to affect my social security check for the rest of my life.
- I only have a year and a half to go, and about \$3,000 or \$5,000 won't go into the equations.
- That is my two cents.

City Manager Edwards

- Adair Village is raising their employee's wages.
- Their employees are on minimum wage and want to increase wage up.

Councilmember Jones

- Everything presented to us is West Coast.
- It's not in this geography.

- I looked and Albany .1% increase.
- CPI is based on house prices.
- Corvallis 3%.

City Planner Eckert

- Is there any by county?

Councilmember Jones

- None by county.
- Portland went up 17%
- Salem .8%

City Manager Edwards

- Is that for the employees or?

Councilmember Jones

- Based on a comparison to the national average?

City Manager Edwards

- I'm curious how that is weighted.
- Based on COLA or CPI.

Councilmember Jones

- They are two different systems.
- I am concerned about how it is written in code.
- Should we have a setup for COLA?

Councilmember Tedrow

- We've had this discussion before, and it keeps coming up.
- Let's re-look at it, and though we agree on a single index.
- Bev could tell us.

Finance Director Manfredo

- It is the Western Clerical Workers under 2.5 million or less people.

Councilmember Tedrow

- That is the index we agree to use.
- And now, with the CPI, do we need to change it?
- If it goes down again, do we change it again?

Councilmember Jones

- We decided on it already.

City Manager Edwards

- You can always re-look at it, and the ordinance said it based on a spring CPI.

- We can raise it later in a separate public hearing.
- It can be changed later if needed if this helps.

Mayor Trulove

- What actions do we need to do?

City Manager Samaniego

- You may vote on it or introduce an amendment.
- We'll vote on the amendment first, then the full budget second.

Mayor Trulove

- It seems we're at a consensus with the budget.

Councilmember Tedrow **MOVED TO ADOPT THE FY 2022 Budget as presented**

Unfinished Business 1: Contracts for Contracted Staff

City Manager Samaniego

- We again have contracts for all staff.
- City Attorney will not change rates, one typo on the contract.
- Special Projects, \$120 is incorrect, actually \$220.
- The rate stays the change.

- City Engineer new rates are included in the packet.
- The \$7,000 limit is still in effect, essentially more per hour.
- Very similar to the city planner, cap at \$7,000 limit, more per hour.

- At the last meeting, we had questions about the rate going from 55 to 73 per hour.
- We haven't done a raise in the last three years.
- For the next three years, this will be the rate.
- Over six years, this comes out to a 5.5% percent increase per year.

- Adair Village sent in their contract for the parks.
- Instead of one year contract, want to do a ten-year contract.
- One of the main reasons is to purchase a new lawnmower.
- \$20,000 mower to continue services.
- They are expanding their service to the tree area along 99E.

Mayor Trulove

- Do we vote on them all at once or by each one?

City Manager Edwards

- You can do whichever you want.

Councilmember Tedrow

- On the Adair contract, is there an annual escalator?

City Manager Samaniego

- Cost of Living Adjustment (COLA.)
- City Manager Edwards confirmed COLA we based.

Councilmember Jones

- Any discussion other than ten years?

City Manager Samaniego

- Matches the sewer system contract.

Councilmember Jones

- So we're talking more than nine years to match with sewer.

City Manager Samaniego

- Yes

City Manager Edwards

- They have agreed to take on the mowing around the trees around 99E.

City Manager Samaniego

- New service by trees along highway 99E will include lawn mowing and weed eating.
- Monthly May through August, as needed, September through April.

City Manager Jones

- Sounds very good

City Manager Edwards

- The longer contract will allow them to buy more equipment, knowing they'll have the income.

Councilmember Tedrow

- How much is the monthly cost for Adair?

City Manager Samaniego

- \$1,372.00 per month, similar to their current one-year agreement.
- We put COLA adjustment in the monthly cost.

Mayor Trulove **MOVED TO ADOPT THE FY 2022 Contracts, change of Adair to nine years** Seconded by Councilmember Jones:

- One heads up, Councilmember Korn (on Zoom) had to step out for the rest of the night, and we do have a quorum with three councilmembers and the Mayor.

New Business 1: AccuFund Grants Module

City Manager Samaniego

- The council needs to okay spending for the AccuFund grant module.
- \$1,695 for the module.
- This will help with tracking upcoming grants and is recommended by the budget committee.

City Manager Edwards

- \$2400 to including setup and training.

Finance Director Manfredo

- We're going to have four to five grants.
- One grant is near \$300,000.
- This is to help keep track off.

Councilmember Jones

- I assume AccuFund was for strictly sewer bills.

Finance Director Manfredo

- No, it's the whole financial accounting.

Councilmember Jones

- Thank you for the clarification.

Finance Director Manfredo

- Also, ARPA (American Rescue Plan Act) will pay for the module since it's infrastructure.

Councilmember Tedrow **MOVED TO PURCHASE The AccuFund Grant Module**
Seconded by Councilmember Jones:

(Bit of delay, Mayor Trulove had stepped out)

Councilmember Tedrow

- Bev, did you say you didn't need the training?

Finance Director Manfredo

- I think I probably do; it's set up and implemented along with training.
- Not sure if I need all the time of training, but some of it.

Councilmember Tedrow **MOVED TO AMEND MOTION TO PURCHASE The AccuFund Grant Module and \$2,400 in training** Seconded by Councilmember Jones:

- This is the same project we applied for last year.

- We didn't receive money from the grant.

Councilmember Tedrow MOVED **APPROVE Resolution 2021-03** Seconded by Councilmember Swenson:

MOTION CARRIED

New Business 4: Council Meeting Date – Ordinance 2021-03

City Manager Samaniego

- We can continue to meet on the second Monday of each month.
- Or meet on a different day each month.
- We have feedback from our City Attorney, Engineer, and Planner (in the packet.)

Mayor Trulove

- I won't be able to attend Tuesday night and usually off work at 6 PM
- But Tuesday firefighting commitment.
- Do we have to change?

City Manager Samaniego

- No

Councilmember Jones

- There have been some good discussions about potential changes.
- Are you fully prepared for a meeting on Monday night?
- After the weekend, are you fully prepared for the meeting?
- Sometimes after a busy weekend, it's a challenge.
- Trying to crunch an hour before the work session and not fair.

City Manager Samaniego

- One of the other reasons we have this ordinance in front of us is to put in our municipal code what date we meet.
- Other cities do, and our Attorney recommends we do the same.
- The other option for dates was the second Tuesday or the fourth Wednesday of the month.

Councilmember Jones

- Could we switch Thursday and Monday with the Planning meetings and City Council meetings?

City Manager Edwards

- We used to meet on the second or fourth Thursday of the month.
- Some past council members asked why do we have to meet on Thursday?

- Move for more time to review the agenda and packet.
- But never codified, charter states have to meet once a month.

Mayor Trulove

- Monday is my day off, the best day for me.

Councilmember Tedrow

- Fine with Monday; I really don't care, not Fridays.

City Manager Samaniego

- From my experience, most communities meet on Tuesday-Thursday.
- Monday in rural communities, Monday Night Football was a reason not to hold meetings.
- The ordinance in front of us formalizes that we keep meetings on the second Monday of the month.

Councilmember Swenson

- I don't mind keeping Monday.
- It's a good point.

Mayor Trulove

- I'd say thank you personally.

Councilmember Jones

- It's too bad Joe had to make changes right before the meeting.

City Manager Edwards

- It happens many times

Councilmember Jones

- But should it happen?

City Manager Samaniego

- I've been getting it where the agenda and packet are available the weeks before.
- The state of Oregon only requires "reasonable notice" for public notice.
- The state of Alaska required five days for public notice.
- Today, with the changes, I try to inform everyone as soon as their a change.
- Post on the website, including in red font, about the updated change.
- Going forward, there is the potential of setting a deadline.

Councilmember Jones

- That's not reasonable.

City Manager Samaniego

- The question, what is reasonable?
- Worth a discussion with the council of when does something gets included in the packet.

Mayor Trulove

- We don't want to change up the agenda and include additional items.

City Manager Samaniego

- Today, we included additional items related to the agenda.
- If something wanted to add something new to the agenda, I would have said no.

City Manager Edwards

- Once the agenda is approved at the council meeting, other items cannot be added.
- It is sent to the next meeting.
- Unless it is an emergency.

Councilmember Jones

- And that's the section others discussion.

City Manager Edwards

- We can also adjust the agenda in the approval of the agenda.

Councilmember Jones

- Are we voting on it tonight?

City Manager Samaniego

- Yes, if we are going to keep the meeting on Monday.
- If we were thinking of moving the meeting day, we would vote on it in July.
- This will formalize the municipal code.
- This will add a new section, 2.04.050, to Regular Council Meeting.

City Manager Edwards

- You have a meeting move location with a three-day notice.
- We had times where we moved meetings within 24 hours.
- This year with COVID, we had.

City Manager Samaniego

- That's a good question; drafting this, I looked up a couple of examples.
- Plus attorney to review. Most places have done the three days.
- This is something if we want to do; the question would be if it's reasonable?
- I have been at a council meeting where water pipes broke.
- So the meeting was relocated, and a red notice was put on the door of the original venue of the new venue.

City Manager Edwards

- Would it be better to say move with three-day public notice?
- Unless there is an emergency or something like that.

Councilmember Swenson

- That's kind of what I was thinking.

City Manager Samaniego

- That is something that can work.
- An amendment to add a new line.

Councilmember Swenson **MOVED TO APPROVE THE AMENDED Ordinance 2021-03, adding a new line, "24-hour notice in the event of an emergency."** Seconded by Mayor Trulove:

Ayes: Councilmember Tedrow, Jones, Swenson, and Mayor Trulove

MOTION CARRIED

New Business July 5 Council Meeting Attendance, ZOOM, & YouTube

City Manager Samaniego

- So very likely, we might be out of a State of Emergency by the next City Council Meeting.
- We can go back to have meetings in person as the primary option.
- Currently, we recommend Zoom and allow the option to come in.
- We will still have Zoom since there is potential legislation where we need to accept electronic comments and testimony.
- We'll have a more permanent solution if that legislation passes.
- We did renew Zoom again for another one-year subscription.

- On YouTube, many cities use it to post their Zoom recordings.
- I checked with the League of Oregon Cities (LOC) on posting videos on YouTube.
- LOC responded yes and okay disabling video comments, but do not block any subscribers if the option is available.
- Wanted to run by the council.

Mayor Trulove

- Will we be live on YouTube?

City Manager Samaniego

- It will be the Zoom recordings of the meetings.

Councilmember Swenson

- So you will be taking the recording and posting it on YouTube?

City Manager Samaniego

- Yes, instead of taking space on the computer, we can have it on YouTube.
- The record retention is a minimum of one year per the state.

Mayor Trulove

- I think we're good with it. Are you good with it, Brad?

Councilmember Tedrow

- I don't know if I like being on YouTube.

Mayor Trulove

- I was wondering about that myself.

City Manager Samaniego

- That is something worth discussing.
- We can adjust or not do so.

Mayor Trulove

- What's the advantage?

City Manager Samaniego

- The advantage would be easier to look up, more accessible, more transparent.

Councilmember Jones

- Same as the minutes.

City Manager Samaniego

- One of the cons is that we're on a bigger website platform that we're not in control of.
- YouTube can do what they want with the content.
- If we don't want to do YouTube, we don't have to.

Mayor Trulove

- I don't think our viewership will be huge.
- I want everyone back together, and I hope we can do that.
- This might be another avenue to separate.
- Come to Tangent on Monday, come to our meeting.
- We're here open for business.

Councilmember Swenson

- I have mixed feelings about this.
- I've been doing YouTube for the last year or so for our church.

- I've been in charge of running the live stream and posting.
- I'm used to doing it, and I think it's fine, and I agree with Mayor Trulove.
- And I like the accessibility.

City Manager Samaniego

- What we can do is not YouTube.
- We'll keep the Zoom files, but after a year, it is gone.
- We have the meeting minutes.

New Business 6: Proposal for Copy Machine

City Manager Samaniego

- We have a new copy machine coming in.
- We need approval from the council for the new machine.
- It saves us (the city) in the long run.
- This new contract saves money on color printing.
- Includes all parts and labor.
- Joe from the Council of Governments (COG) said they could install it on the network, so any computer on the network can print.

Councilmember Jones

- Where is that proposal?

City Manager Samaniego

- It is on page 201 out of 2013.

City Manager Edwards

- Is this the same group that we've been getting the copier?

City Finance Director Manfredo

- This is the same guy that came by a year ago and talked to us about changing over.
- He waited for it to go up again.

City Manager Edwards

- Would we be obligated to the other copier contract?

City Finance Director Manfredo

- He will pay it off.

Councilmember Jones

- What's this company name?

City Finance Director Manfredo

- Ultrex

Councilmember Jones

- They are very good; they're local, ship toner.
- Good customer service; they work with the church he attends.
- You virtually pay for paper, not black and white.

City Manager Edwards

- Would it change to \$305.67 per month, 320.67?

Councilmember Tedrow

- The \$305.67 per month.

Councilmember Jones

- What size paper are we printing on right now?

City Manager Edwards

- Usually 8.5 x 11.

Councilmember Jones

- Do you do some larger stuff?

City Finance Director Manfredo

- We do, we do 11 x 17, 14 x 17, and 8.5 x 11.

Councilmember Jones

- This copier is capable of doing that>

City Finance Director Manfredo

- Yes.

Councilmember Jones

- If it's like for like, I have no objections if it runs the same size paper.

Councilmember Tedrow **MOVED TO APPROVE THE purchase of the copier**

MONTHLY REPORT TO THE TANGENT CITY COUNCIL

From: Joe Samaniego, City Manager

The new fiscal year is here, and I am looking forward to working a full fiscal year with everyone here at Tangent. We are fully reopened but following COVID cases in the southern hemisphere, where it is currently winter. Just in case we see a risk of cases in the fall or winter going up, we'll be prepared.

City Hall has been busy wrapping up two grants, end of the fiscal year budget, and researching improved processes and policies for businesses and residents of Tangent. The most visible sign is the website which is becoming more mobile-friendly.

From my one-on-one meetings with each council member, the two most common themes were "controlled growth" and "community involvement." Controlled growth is part of the Comprehensive Plan; we have good ordinances to ensure controlled growth, and overall feel we're in a good spot.

We have also learned that we have room to improve. We have been aware of code enforcement challenges and a desire to improve the city approach in code enforcement. This is also vital for public safety, and the city is preparing to address these issues in the coming months.

I want to thank the City Council for allowing me to have the first two and half months to work with Georgia. I learned much valuable information no City Manager would have just from years of experience. Rarely does a new City Manager come into with an opportunity to work with the longtime City Manager. Georgia has done a lot for the City of Tangent, and I will ensure that going forward, I can continue to deliver for the City of Tangent.
